EMPLOYMENT OF DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY RESOURCES IN SUP-
PORT OF THE UNITED STATES SECRET SERVICE

Effective 1 May 1969

Local supplementation of this regulation is prohibited except upon approval of the Deputy Chief
of Staff for Military Operations.

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1. Purpose. This regulation executes DOD Directive 3025.13, 15 July 1968, and contains policy and procedures for providing Department of the Army resources in support of the United States Secret Service.

2. Applicability. The procedures established in this regulation are for requesting and approving all support required other than that for the President, the Vice-President, the President elect, the Vice-President elect, or those members of their families authorized Secret Service protection. However, the reporting procedures established herein will be followed when providing support to the United States Secret Service for the protection of these individuals.

3. Background and authority. An agreement has been executed between the Department of Defense and the Department of the Treasury concerning support which will be provided the United States Secret Service in the performance of its protective responsibilities. DOD Directive 3025.13, 15 July 1968, establishes DOD policy for execution of the agreement and assigns responsibilities for furnishing support.

4. Type of support provided. The Department of Defense shall, upon request, provide the Secret Service with medical service, aircraft and crews, ordnance disposal, criminal investigators, counter-

intelligence personnel, motor vehicles, communications, and such other support as may be necessary to assist the Secret Service in the performance of its protective functions.

5. Actual expenses and special per diem authorized. Military personnel assigned to duty in support of the United States Secret Service may be reimbursed actual expenses in accordance with paragraph M4005, Joint Travel Regulations, when authorized as provided in paragraphs M4002 and M4003, Joint Travel Regulations. They may be entitled to special per diem allowances for travel outside the United States when authorized in accordance with the provisions of Part H, Joint Travel Regulations.

6. Command policy. Personnel assigned to support the United States Secret Service are subject to the overall supervision and direction of the Director, United States Secret Service, or his authorized representative for the duration of their assignment.

7. Approving authority. a. The approving authority for all normal and routine requests for support is The Special Assistant to the Secretary of Defense, or his authorized representative.

b. In urgent cases, military commanders may respond to requests for support as circumstances justify; however, all requests so met will be re-

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ported through channels to The Special Assistant to the Secretary of Defense by the most expeditious means available.

8. Procedures. *a.* Requests will be submitted by the Director, United States Secret Service to The Special Assistant to the Secretary of Defense for his approval. Approved requests are then forwarded in the form of requirements through the National Military Command Center (NMCC) to a Military Department in CONUS or a Unified Command overseas as appropriate.

b. Requirements assigned to the Department of the Army will be passed by the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations, Army Operations Center, to the major Army command, Army staff agency, or other appropriate command by telephone or electrical message. The Army Operations Center (AOC) will assign each requirement a DA identification number. The command or agency assigned to provide the required support will, at the earliest convenient time, contact the designated Secret Service Agent and confirm details of the requirement. Commands or agencies providing support will not question the validity of approved requirements. Modification of a requirement to more efficiently perform the mission is authorized provided the designated Secret Service Agent agrees.

c. Commanders acting upon urgent requests as outlined in paragraph 7*b* should, if time and circumstances permit, seek approval for their actions through normal command channels. Requests for approval must be accompanied by a recommended course of action.

9. Operational reporting. *a.* Commands and agencies providing support requested by routine procedures will report by message the following information to DA FOR ODCSOPS-OD-AOC. These reports are exempt from reports control under provisions of paragraph 7-2*a*, AR 335-15.

- (1) DA identification number (if known).
- (2) Unit providing support.
- (3) Names of personnel involved (where appropriate).
- (4) Support provided.

b. Reports on urgent requests (para 7*b*) will be submitted by telephone to the AOC, the Pentagon and confirmed by electrical message to Department of the Army, ATTN: OPS OD AOC. The report will include as much detail as is available. The following guide will be used:

- (1) Date request received.
- (2) Requesting agency or individual. (Be specific; e.g., Agent W. A. Jones, United States Secret Service Office, Anytown, USA, telephone code 123-489-1009.)
- (3) Unit receiving request.
- (4) Support requested. (Include name of individual being protected.)
- (5) Support provided.
- (6) Unit providing support.

10. Accounting. *a.* Costs will be recorded within the framework of the existing accounting systems.

b. Support will be provided the United States Secret Service on a nonreimbursable basis; therefore, detailed reports will not be submitted to the Department of the Army unless directed by Comptroller of the Army. Such requirements will be established in accordance with AR 335-15.
