**OFFICERS HONORARY RETIREL LIST**

Effective 15 February 1974

*This revision defines more specifically personnel who are eligible or not eligible for placement on the Honorary Retired List. Local supplementation of this regulation is prohibited except upon approval of The Adjutant General.*

**1. General.** The Officers Honorary Retired List was established by section I, WD General Orders 11, 1945, to provide a measure of recognition for officers and former officers of the Army of the United States—not members of the Regular Army—who have served faithfully and well during national emergencies or for long periods.

**2. Publication of list.** *a.* The Officers Honorary Retired List is published biennially by The Adjutant General as a section of the US Army Register. It consists of an alphabetical listing of officers, showing name, grade, Army service number, social security number, component, and permanent address.

*b.* One copy of each current list will be furnished each officer listed.

**3. Eligible personnel.** Officers in the following categories are eligible to apply for inclusion on the Officers Honorary Retired List. (See exclusions in para 4.)

*a.* An officer of the Retired Reserve of the Army who has served honorably on active duty as an officer in time of national emergency or who has completed 15 years of honorable service in an active or inactive status (including warrant officer and enlisted service) in any component of the Armed Forces of the United States.

*b.* A former commissioned officer of the Army who has served honorably and who meets one of the following conditions—

(1) Has reached the age of 60 years.

(2) Has completed 15 years of honorable service in an active or inactive status (including warrant officer and enlisted service) in any component of the Armed Forces of the United States.

(3) Has served honorably in time of national emergency, but is not eligible for appointment in the Reserve of the Army.

**4. Noneligible personnel.** The following are not eligible for inclusion on the Officers Honorary Retired List—

*a.* Officers on the Regular Army Retired List.

*b.* Officers on the Army of the United States Retired List.

*c.* Officers in the Retired Reserve who have completed 20 or more years of qualifying service for retired pay at age 60 (AR 135-180).

**5. Placement on list.** *a.* Eligible officers will be placed on the Officers Honorary Retired List only at their own request. Applications for inclusion will be made in letter form and will be sent to the Commander, US Army Reserve Components Personnel and Administration Center, ATTN: AGUZ-RAD, 9700 Page Boulevard, St. Louis, MO 63132. The officer's full name, grade, Army service number, social security number, permanent address, and the facts which justify support of his claim to eligibility will be included. The official Department of the Army records of each ap-

plicant will be reviewed and approved or denied, based on individual merits.

b. Once placed on the Officers Honorary Retired List, each officer is required to forward to the Commander, US Army Reserve Components Personnel and Administrative Center, not later than 1 July of each odd-numbered year, his current permanent address.

**6. Grade, pay, and allowances.** No pay and allowance or advancement in grade will accrue to an officer as a result of his being placed on the Officers Honorary Retired List.

**7. Removal from list.** An officer's name will be removed from the Officers Honorary Retired List because of—

- a. Death.
- b. Misconduct. Misconduct is conduct un-

becoming an officer and gentleman, or conduct that will bring discredit on the military service (includes violation of the dress code described in AR 670-5).

c. Misuse or attempted misuse of the Honorary Retired Identification card.

d. Failure to report current permanent address (para 5).

e. Placement on another DA retired list.

f. Submission of the officer's written request for removal to the Commander, US Army Reserve Components Personnel and Administration Center.

**8. Order to active duty.** In time of war or national emergency, an officer on the Officers Honorary Retired List who also holds an appointment in the Reserve of the Army may be ordered to active duty.
