**FLYING PROFICIENCY OF AIR FORCE PERSONNEL ON
DUTY WITH UNITED STATES ARMY**

1. Purpose and scope. This regulation prescribes procedures enabling Air Force rated personnel on duty with the Army to maintain flying proficiency.

2. Responsibilities. Rated Air Force personnel on flying status who are on duty with the Army for periods in excess of 1 month at locations lacking flying facilities will contact the commander at the nearest Air Force flying activity, in accordance with AFM 60-1. Commanders will insure that personnel are given the opportunity to perform flight training required in compliance with AFM 60-1.

3. Transportation expense. Reimbursement to such personnel for transportation or other expense incident to meeting proficiency flying requirements is not authorized. Orders issued covering travel incident to such duty will stipulate "at no expense to the Government."
