Effective 15 May 1969 in accordance with DA message 909049

AR 601-19, 7 October 1965, is changed as follows:

Page 7. Paragraph 9e is superseded as follows:

e. All participants are entitled to receive pay and allowances in the appropriate grade of Reserves on active duty. (See parts 1 and 3, DOD Military Pay and Allowances Entitlements Manual.)

ARMY STUDENT NURSE, DIETITIAN, AND OCCUPATIONAL THERAPIST PROGRAMS**

AR 601-19, 7 October 1965, is changed as follows:
✓ Page 2, paragraph 3b (7). In line 3, the words "as a licensed registered nurse" are deleted.

✓ Page 5. Paragraph 6c(2)(e) is superseded as follows:
(e) Male applicants without prior military service and under the age of 26 years. These applicants will sign the following statement of acknowledgment of understanding of service required:

In connection with my enlistment as a Reserve of the Army, THIS DATE, I hereby agree to and understand that—

I incur a military service obligation of 6 years.

I will enter on 36 months' active duty.

Upon completion of 36 months' active duty I will serve satisfactorily in the Ready Reserve as follows:

If I voluntarily join a Ready Reserve unit I will participate satisfactorily for at least 1 year in all scheduled drills and annual active duty for training (not less than 14 days per year) of that unit unless excused therefrom by proper authority. If I am not assigned to a unit or should proper authority transfer me from a unit to the Individual Ready Reserve until the fifth anniversary of my enlistment and while so assigned will participate satisfactorily by performing, when directed, not more than 30 days active duty for training annually. I understand that as a reservist, I must reply promptly to any military correspondence directed to me. If in any year I fail to perform satisfactorily the required training, I can be ordered to perform active duty for training for 45 days.

Upon satisfactorily completing 1 year of unit service or the fifth anniversary of my enlistment, whichever occurs first, I will be eligible for transfer to the Standby Reserve for the remainder of my service obligation and will be so transferred unless I elect to remain in the Ready Reserve by executing the appropriate Department of the Army agreement.

In the event of war or national emergency declared by Congress, my enlistment which would otherwise expire, will be continued in effect until 6 months after the end of such war or emergency, unless sooner terminated.

Page 6. Paragraph 8a is superseded as follows:
a. Enlistment for women as a Reserve in the Woman's Army Corps, Army Reserve, will be for 4 years. Initial enlistment for men under the age 26 as a Reserve in the U.S. Army Reserve, will be for 6 years; other males will be enlisted or reenlisted as a Reserve in the U.S. Army Reserve for 4 years. Individuals will be ordered to active duty for 36 months for participation in these programs in enlisted status unless sooner discharged under appropriate authority.

✓ Page 6. Paragraph 8b is superseded as follows:

b. Enlisted members or commissioned officers may be permitted to remain on active duty beyond the completion date of the educational program in an ordinary or excess leave status in accordance with AR 630-5 until requirements for a commission are completed and/or until date of initial duty assignment to a military medical installation.

✓ Page 10. Paragraph 11b(4) is superseded as follows:

(4) Following completion of the educational program, officer participants may be reassigned without regard to the result of the nurse licensure examination. The Adjutant General will issue assignment instructions, as required by The Surgeon General, which will normally provide for approximately 6 weeks TDY to the Student Detachment, Medical Field Service School, Fort Sam Houston, Tex., while en route to new duty station, for the purpose of attendance at the Army Medical Department Officer Basic Course.

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this regulation; nor may they accept stipends or other cash emoluments from the school in which they are enrolled during this period.

3. **Obligations.** *a.* Each participating student, at the earliest date upon which qualified, will be obligated to—

- (1) Accept, if otherwise eligible, an appointment in the U.S. Army Reserve, as a second lieutenant, Army Nurse Corps or Army Medical Specialist Corps, as appropriate; or if appointment is tendered prior to 21st birthday accept a temporary appointment without specification of component.
- (2) Serve on active duty under that appointment for a period of time determined by the time spent in the program under the provisions of this regulation, as follows:

<i>Time spent in civilian institutions in enlisted and/or officer status</i>	<i>Obligated tour of active duty as an officer</i>
12 months or less-----	24 months
Over 12 months, not to exceed 24 months-----	36 months

b. The obligated service period includes the period spent in the ANC-AMSC Officer Basic Course and begins—

- (1) For nurses—on the date of initial assignment to a military medical installation, ~~as a licensed registered nurse.~~
- (2) For dietitians—12 months (Dietetic internship, AR 601-136) after the date of the initial assignment to a military medical installation.
- (3) For occupational therapists—on the date computed by adding the length of the Clinical Affiliation (AR 601-136) to the date of initial assignment to a military medical installation.

c. Male applicants for participation in programs under the provisions of this regulation will be advised of any service obligation they may incur as delineated in AR 135-90. In the case of participants who have an obligation under the Universal Military Training and Service Act, as amended, active duty under this program will serve to discharge an equivalent amount of the participant's obligated active duty thereunder, and will be computed from time of original enlistment or appointment.

4. **Eligibility.** An applicant for participation in any of these programs must—

a. Meet the eligibility requirements for enlistment under the provisions of AR 140-111, except as indicated herein.

b. Not have reached the 28th birthday on date of enlistment. In exceptional cases, waiver for over-age may be granted provided applicant's age on date of appointment will be less than 30 years. Male applicants under 18 and female applicants under 21 years of age must furnish the written consent of parent or guardian. See AR 140-111.

c. Meet the eligibility requirements for appointment in the Regular Army Nurse Corps or Regular Army Medical Specialist Corps, as appropriate, which are specified in Section II, AR 601-124, except: the educational and professional requirements contained in paragraph 12, AR 601-124 and, for male applicants, the provisions of paragraph 7a, AR 601-124.

d. Meet medical fitness standards prescribed in Chapter 2, AR 40-501. Review of reports of medical examination and determination of medical fitness will be accomplished by The Surgeon General.

e. Possess high personal, scholastic, and moral qualifications.

f. Be matriculated as a full-time student in—

(1) A hospital or collegiate school of nursing acceptable to the Department of the Army, and at the time of enlistment or appointment be qualified to participate in the Army Student Nurse Program for the specified period of training (not to exceed 24 months) prior to completing requirements for graduation from the school of nursing. Or—

(2) A home economics program of study in an approved college or university which includes specific courses recommended by the American Dietetic Association. Applicant at the time of enlistment must be qualified to participate in the Army Students Dietition Program for the specified period of training (not to exceed 24 months) necessary to complete all requirements so that upon graduation from college the participant meets the eligibility requirements for the Army Dietetic In-

ternship as required under the provisions of AR 601-136. Or—

- (3) An occupational therapy curriculum in an approved college or university and, at the time of enlistment, be qualified to participate in the Army Student Occupational Therapy Program for a specified period of training (not to exceed 24 months) and complete the educational and eligibility requirements for a clinical affiliation under one of the following plans:

(a) *Plan I.* At the time of graduation from college, or completion of academic requirements for the advanced standing course, student must meet the eligibility requirements for the Army Occupational Therapy Clinical Affiliation under the provisions of AR 601-136.

(b) *Plan II.* Selected students from certain occupational therapy curricula, which require graduates to participate in civilian clinical affiliations in medical centers with which the college or university affiliates, may participate in the Army Occupational Therapy Student Program in enlisted status during the last 12 months of college and for not more than 12 months in a civilian clinical affiliation.

(c) *Plan III.* The student who participates in the Army Student Occupational Therapy Program for 24 months in the college and is required to participate in a civilian clinical affiliation, may be permitted to enter on ordinary or excess leave status in accordance with paragraphs 7 and 17, AR 630-5, during the period of civilian affiliation. At the end of this period, student participants will be commissioned if qualified in accordance with AR 601-139 and will serve on active duty for a period not less than 36 months (para. 3a(2)).

g. On the date of entrance into the program—

- (1) If a female, be enlisted in the U.S. Army Reserve for service in the Women's Army Corps, USAR, or be commissioned as a second lieutenant, ANC-USAR, or if prior to the 21st birthday, be commissioned as a second lieutenant without specification of component.

- (2) If a male, be enlisted as a Reserve for service in the USAR, or be commissioned as a second lieutenant, ANC-USAR, or if prior to the 21st birthday be commissioned as a second lieutenant without specification of component.

5. *Grade.* a. Students without prior service in the Armed Forces who are selected for these programs will be enlisted in grade E-3 in the U.S. Army Reserve. No further promotion in an enlisted grade is authorized during the period enrolled in this program. Approximately 6 months prior to graduation, the Department of the Army will tender appointments in the grade of second lieutenant to qualified enlisted participants or to newly selected applicants enrolled in a collegiate school of nursing, for assignment to the Army Nurse Corps.

b. Applicants selected for participation in the program who are already members of the U.S. Army Reserve or the Army National Guard of the United States may voluntarily accept administrative reduction to grade E-3 and be ordered to active duty in enlisted grade E-3 for participation in these programs, provided their remaining period of enlistment is sufficient to cover the required period of training and the time necessary to qualify for a commission as an officer. Members of the ARNGUS with insufficient time remaining in current enlistment will be extended under the provisions of NGR 25-1 for a period sufficient to cover the required period of training. Members of the USAR with insufficient time remaining in enlistment to cover the required period of training will be discharged under the provisions of paragraphs 6a and 9b(2), AR 135-178, and be reenlisted in grade E-3.

6. *Application.* a. Application for entry into one of the programs will be forwarded direct to The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP, Department of the Army, Washington, D.C., 20315. The words "Army Student Nurse Program," "Army Student Dietitian Program," or "Army Student Occupational Therapy Program," as appropriate, will be written in the upper right corner of the face of each sheet.

b. To insure financial support for tuition and other authorized expenditures from the time of formal acceptance into this program, applications of student nurses enrolled in collegiate schools of nursing, must be forwarded to reach

OTSG not later than 60 days prior to the beginning of training period (e.g., semester, trimester, or quarter) for which this support is sought. Tuitional and related financial support will be effective with the beginning of the first full term of schooling following the arrangement of a tuitional contract with the institution of the applicant's choice. Applications which are not received in the time specified will be processed as expeditiously as possible.

c. The application for each of these programs is composed of the following forms and allied documents:

- (1) DD Form 4 (Enlistment Record—Armed Forces of the United States) in duplicate. Items 7, 8, and 38 through 42 will not be completed until selection has been made and enlistment is actually being accomplished.
- (2) A signed statement will be attached containing the following agreement by the applicant:
 - (a) *Student nurses enrolled in acceptable hospital programs offering a diploma in nursing.*

I hereby apply for and agree to accept enlistment (for women) as a Reserve of the Army for service in the Women's Army Corps, U.S. Army Reserve, or (for men) as a Reserve of the Army for service in the U.S. Army Reserve, and concurrent order to active duty with initial station at my school for the purpose of participating in the Army Student Nurse Program. I further agree that 4 months prior to completion of my training under this program, I will apply for appointment as second lieutenant, for service in the Army Nurse Corps, U.S. Army Reserve, or a temporary appointment without specification of component, as may be appropriate, and, if tendered, I will accept such appointment and agree to serve on active duty for a period of 2 years beginning on the date of initial duty assignment to a military medical installation. I understand that this period of obligated time is in addition to any time spent in a student status after completion of the ANC-AMSC Officer's Basic Course.

- (b) *Student nurses enrolled in collegiate schools of nursing, offering a baccalaureate degree in nursing.*

I hereby apply for and agree to accept enlistment (for women) as a Reserve of

the Army for service in the Women's Army Corps, U.S. Army Reserve, or (for men) as a Reserve of the Army for service in the U.S. Army Reserve, and concurrent order to active duty with initial station at my school for the purpose of participating in the Army Student Nurse Program. I further agree that at least 9 months prior to completion of my training under this program, I will apply for appointment as second lieutenant for service in the Army Nurse Corps, Army Reserve, or if prior to my 21st birthday a temporary appointment without specification of component, as may be appropriate, and, if tendered, I will accept such appointment and agree to serve on active duty for a period of -- years (insert 2 or 3, as applicable). I understand that this period of obligated time will begin on the date of initial duty assignment to a military medical installation and is in addition to any time spent in a student status after completion of the ANC-AMSC Officer's Basic Course.

- (c) *Student dietitians.*

I hereby apply for and agree to accept enlistment (for women) as a Reserve of the Army for service in the Women's Army Corps, U.S. Army Reserve, or (for men) as a Reserve of the Army in the U.S. Army Reserve, and concurrent order to active duty with station at my college for the purpose of participating in the Army Student Dietitian Program. I further agree that 6 months prior to completion of this program, I will apply for participation in the Army Dietetic Internship and appointment as second lieutenant, Army Medical Specialist Corps, U.S. Army Reserve, or if prior to my 21st birthday a temporary appointment without specification of component and will agree to serve on active duty for a period of ---- years (insert 2 or 3, as applicable), not counting any period served as an intern, as obligated by the period of time I will have spent as an enlisted participant in the Army Student Dietitian Program.

- (d) *Student occupational therapists.*

I hereby apply for and agree to accept enlistment (for women) as a Reserve of the Army for service in the Women's Army Corps, U.S. Army Reserve, or (for men) as a Reserve of the Army in the U.S. Army Reserve, and concurrent order to active duty with station at my college, for the purpose of participating in the Army Student Occupational Therapy Program. I further agree that 6 months prior to completion of my training under Plan I, I will apply for par-

participation in the Army Occupational Therapy Clinical Affiliation and appointment as second lieutenant, Army Medical Specialist Corps, Army Reserve, or if prior to my 21st birthday a temporary appointment without specification of component, and will agree to serve on active duty for a period of ____ years (insert 2 or 3, as applicable), not counting any period served in the clinical affiliation, as obligated by the period of time I will have spent as an enlisted participant in the Army Student Therapy Program.

Or—Plan II or Plan III

I hereby apply for and agree to accept enlistment (for women) as a Reserve of the Army for service in the Women's Army Corps, Army Reserve, or (for men) for service as a Reserve of the Army in the U.S. Army Reserve, and concurrent order to active duty with station at my college, for the purpose of participating in the Army Student Occupational Therapy Program. I further agree that 6 months prior to completion of this program, I will apply for appointment as second lieutenant, Army Medical Specialist Corps, Army Reserve, or if prior to my 21st birthday a temporary appointment without specification of component under the provisions of AR 601-139, and will agree to serve on active duty for a period of ____ years (insert 2 or 3, as applicable), as obligated by the period of time I will have spent as an enlisted participant in the Army Student Occupational Therapy Program.

(e) ~~Male applicants without prior military service and under the age of 26 years.~~

These applicants will also sign the statement of acknowledgment of understanding of service required according to format D of AR 140-111.

- (3) Standard Form 88 (Report of Medical Examination) in duplicate, and Standard Form 89 (Report of Medical History) in duplicate, and report of consultations, if indicated, in duplicate, accomplished at a military medical facility or Armed Forces Examining and Entrance Station (see AR 601-270). Where it is more advantageous to the Government, medical examination may be conducted by examiners as provided in AR 140-120, or by a physician of the institution's health service at the school where the student is located. This examination

will be valid for enlistment or appointment purposes for a period of 1 year.

- (4) Waiver of medical requirements granted by Headquarters, Department of the Army, will be recorded on all copies of DD Form 4 and Standard Form 88 as follows:

- (5) DD Form 98 (Armed Forces Security Questionnaire) in duplicate, properly witnessed.
- (6) DD Form 373 (Consent, Declaration of Parent or Legal Guardian for Enlistment of a Minor in the U.S. Armed Forces) in duplicate and birth certificate, if applicable.
- (7) Transcript of college or school of nursing credits earned to date. High school transcripts are not required. In addition, student dietitians will submit a listing of all courses as required by the American Dietetic Association, to include name of course, course number, and semester hours to be taken.
- (8) Photostat or true copy of DD Form 214 (Armed Forces of the United States Report of Transfer or Discharge) if applicable.
- (9) Interservice transfers will be accomplished as prescribed by Section VII, AR 140-10.
- (10) A recent 3 by 5 inch photograph, head and shoulder type.
- (11) Statement from appropriate dean or director of school regarding program completion date, anticipated date of licensure, if applicable, and recommendations. For dietitians, recommendations will include American Dietetic Association plan (Plan II or Plan III) under which student will qualify at time of graduation.
- (12) Personal evaluations from at least two major instructors.
- (13) Student dietitians and occupational therapists will submit a short autobiography.

- (14) Student nurses in collegiate programs will complete DA Form 3052-R (Worksheet for Tuition Contract—Army Student Nurse Program) (fig. 1). DA Form 3052-R will be reproduced locally on 8" by 10½" paper.
- (15) DD Form 398 (Statement of Personal History), in four copies, completed, signed and properly witnessed.
- (16) DA Form 340 (National Agency Check) in six copies.
- (17) FD Form 258 (U.S. Department of Justice Fingerprint Card) in duplicate.
- (18) DA Form 61 (Application for Appointment) in duplicate, completed except for item 28 and 29.
- (19) DA Form 160 (Application for Active Duty) in duplicate, completed through item 9.

7. Selection. a. Selection for participation in these programs will be made from those applicants considered to be medically and otherwise qualified by a board of officers designated by The Surgeon General. Each applicant will be notified by The Surgeon General of selection or nonselection.

b. Selected applicants will advise The Surgeon General of their acceptance or nonacceptance within 5 days of receipt of notification.

8. Period of enlistment. a. ~~Initial enlistment for women as a Reserve in the Women's Army Corps, Army Reserve, will be for 4 years. Initial enlistment for men under 26 years of age as a Reserve in the U.S. Army Reserve will be for 6 years. Individuals will be ordered to active duty for 12 or 24 months for participation in these programs and are entitled to receive pay and allowances of their grade for these periods. The period spent in commissioned officer status during training will be included in a 12 or 24 month period (para. 11b).~~

b. ~~Enlistee or commissioned officer will be permitted to remain on active duty, when necessary beyond the 12 or 24 month period, in an ordinary or excess leave status in accordance with Sections III and V, AR 630-5, until registered licensure (in the case of professional nurses) and/or requirements for commission are completed and until date of initial duty assignment to a military medical installation.~~

9. Processing. a. Enlistment of selected applicants will be accomplished by the appropriate U.S. Army Recruiting District. At time of enlistment,

all selectees whose date of medical examination is in excess of 1 year prior to anticipated enlistment date will be required to undergo a new medical examination in accordance with AR 40-501. See paragraph 6c(3). When, at the time of enlistment, the medical examination was conducted within the 1 year validity period, the following statement will be signed by each selected applicant:

MEDICAL STATEMENT

(Do Not Alter)

To the best of my knowledge and belief, there has been no change in my physical condition subsequent to the last examination which I took on or about ----- for enlistment in (for women) the Women's Army Corps. USAR (for men), the Army Reserve (strike out non-applicable words) and I am not now suffering from any defect or deformity not then recorded.

(Applicant's signature)

Note. In the event the above statement cannot be signed in its present form, enlistment will not be accomplished and a new report of medical examination will be submitted at the earliest possible date that the applicant's physical condition will permit.

b. Processing for women will be the same as for other Women's Army Corps enlistees, except that WEST and AFWST, DA Form 524 (Request for Report from Mental Hospitals), DD Form 369 (Police Record Check), DD Form 370 (Request for Report from (Employer)—(School)—(Personnel Reference), Army Classification Battery (ACB)), and character references will not be required. Processing for men will be the same as for all other male enlistees in the Army.

c. Prior to enlistment, reenlistment, or appointment as second lieutenant, whichever is earlier, each applicant will be interviewed by the officer authorized to enlist or administer the oath of office, at which time pay and allowances for active duty, service creditable for pay purposes, medical care, retirement benefits, leave and pass policies and regulations, obligation for service, and other benefits, will be explained.

d. Section V, AR 350-200 provides for participants enrolled in collegiate schools of nursing to be reimbursed for expenses incurred as the result of training beginning with the date of the first full term of school following enlistment. Reimbursement for the above mentioned training and the contract for tuition and other fees is arranged by The Surgeon General, Department

of the Army. Requests for information regarding contracts should be addressed to The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-TC, Department of the Army, Washington, D.C., 20315.

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~~c. Participants will be entitled to receive pay and allowances in the appropriate grade of Reserves on active duty. Payment of quarters allowance is not authorized when quarters are furnished in kind, without rental charge, on behalf of the United States. Payment of subsistence allowance is not authorized when meals are furnished without charge on behalf of the United States (see para. 10311e and 10411f, AR 37-104).~~

f. No uniforms will be issued to enlistees nor will allowances for clothing be paid to any enlisted participant while enrolled in these programs.

g. Identification card, DD Form 2A, will be issued to each participant in these programs.

h. After appointment and entry on active duty as commissioned officers in the Army Nurse Corps or Army Medical Specialist Corps, participants in these programs will be entitled to initial uniform allowance of \$200 and active duty allowance of \$100 under the provisions of Chapter 7, Part I, AR 37-104. Such allowance normally will be paid upon initial assignment to a military installation.

i. The oath of enlistment may be accomplished at an Armed Forces Examining and Entrance Station, or, when more advantageous to the Government, at any other military installation.

10. Administration while student is on active duty and assigned to a Student Detachment.

a. The commanding officer of the Student Detachment of the Army headquarters in which area the school is located will be responsible for the administration of participants during periods of active duty, including the preparation of required records incident thereto. In addition to notification of action specified in *b* and *c* below, copies of all orders of personnel actions affecting the status of students from the time of enlistment and as changes occur thereafter, will be forwarded to The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP.

b. In the event a female participant is married while serving on active duty under these programs, participant will immediately notify the commanding officer of the Student Detachment who is responsible for her military records.

Published orders announcing official change of name will be forwarded as in *a* above.

c. A female participant who fails to qualify as a potential officer during the period she is enrolled under these programs by reason of academic failure, inability to qualify for nurse registration, or for other valid reasons beyond her control, as determined by the Department of the Army, will be discharged from enlisted status at the discretion of the Secretary of the Army, under the provisions of AR 635-205. An enlisted male participant who fails to qualify as a potential officer during the period he is enrolled under these programs by reason of academic failure, inability to qualify for nurse registration, or any other reason, will be reported by the commanding officer of the Student Detachment to the Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP, for recommendation to the appropriate Department of Army Staff Agency. Participants in an officer status will be released from active duty or discharged in accordance with AR 135-173 or AR 635-105. Voluntary withdrawal from these programs will be permitted only under the most exceptional circumstances, as determined by the Department of the Army. Applications for withdrawal will be forwarded with appropriate documentation and recommendation to The Adjutant General, ATTN: AGPO-XD, Department of the Army, Washington, D.C., 20315, for decision.

d. Enlisted women being separated for pregnancy will be processed in accordance with AR 635-210, by the Army commander responsible for her records. Notification will be submitted to The Surgeon General as shown in *a* above. In the case of women officers, the provisions of Section VII or XI, of AR 635-120, as appropriate, will apply.

e. Participants enrolled in college or university programs where the nursing, home economics, or occupational therapy required curricula are not continued during the summer months, will not be required to continue their education during this period unless required subjects cannot be obtained within the regular academic year. In instances where the required courses are not offered during the summer in the educational institution where the student is enrolled, the student will enroll in another college or university for the summer session. Student occupational therapists may par-

ticipate in affiliation as scheduled by the director. They may be granted ordinary leave of absence prior to the beginning and/or at the end of the summer sessions as indicated in paragraph 7, AR 630-5. Prior to registration for summer session, student will be counseled by the school advisor regarding the required courses. The student will notify the commanding officer of the Student Detachment and The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-TP, of the course titles, tuition fees (student nurses), and inclusive dates of registration for the required summer session. This notification must reach the respective addressees not later than 60 days prior to commencement of the summer session. Students not attending summer school may apply for and be placed on ordinary leave to the extent accrued, and then will be placed on excess leave without pay and allowances for the period remaining until the next semester.

f. During periods of school vacation, student enlistees and commissioned officers may be granted leave in accordance with Section III, AR 630-5. The student will submit dates ordinary leave is desired to the commanding officer of the Student Detachment.

g. The Commanding General, each Army area, as an exception to limitations imposed by AR 630-5, may grant necessary periods of excess leave without pay and allowances pending receipt of nurse licensure and orders to active duty, without referral to Headquarters, Department of the Army. While the student is participating in this program, advance leave will normally not be granted. In those exceptional cases, prior to the granting of advance leave, The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP, will be notified immediately (*j*(2) (*g*) below).

h. Absences such as school affiliation and/or conferences, lectures, in connection with studies, and intervals of school dismissal other than vacations when school is not in session, if the student remains in the immediate vicinity of the school, will not be chargeable as leave.

i. During the period subsequent to graduation, enlistees and commissioned officers may be granted ordinary leave in the amount accrued at time of graduation plus any leave accrued during the ordinary leave granted at that time. As an alternative, or upon completion of ordinary leave, enlistees and officers may be placed on excess leave

without pay (para. 21, AR 630-5) until ordered to report to the Student Detachment, Medical Field Service School, Brooke Army Medical Center, Fort Sam Houston, Tex. (para. 11). Payment for basic allowance for quarters and subsistence is not authorized during the leave period subsequent to graduation and reassignment (para. 10312, AR 37-104.

j. The following will apply:

(1) *For participants enrolled in hospital schools of nursing, programs of home economics, and curricula of occupational therapy—*

(a) A National Agency Check will be initiated by the commanding officer of the Student Detachment as soon as practicable after enlistment, and in any event, at least 9 months prior to the date enlistee is expected to complete requirements for graduation from the school where enrolled. Appropriate entry will be made in item 21, DD Form 398 (Statement of Personal History) to the effect that the National Agency Check has been completed, including date and results.

(b) The payment of tuition and other fees incident to attendance at school will remain the responsibility of the individual participant.

(c) At the end of each semester and summer session, student dietitian and occupational therapy enlistees will forward an official transcript of college credits to the commanding officer, Student Detachment, to which assigned, who in turn will forward it to The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP. Student dietitians will also include a listing of courses in which enrolled for the next semester or summer session.

(2) *For participants enrolled in collegiate schools of nursing—*

(a) A National Agency Check will be initiated on student participants by The Surgeon General, Department of the Army.

(b) The cost of training will be defrayed by the Department of the Army. The cost of a particular program of instruc-

tion is defined as the inherent expense incident thereto such as tuition fees, library fees, and graduation fees. This cost also includes textbooks and expendable supplies as authorized in Section V, AR 350-200.

- (c) Financial assistance is authorized for full school terms only. Financial assistance will begin with the first date of the first full school term following enlistment or appointment and will continue until normal completion of requirements for degree.
- (d) Normally, participants will be eligible for financial assistance for a maximum period of 24 months.
- (e) Payment of tuition and fees and reimbursement for expenses will be authorized for terms beyond normally specified lengths of schooling if such extensions are due to reasons other than academic failure, e.g., illness resulting in authorized leave of absence from the educational institution.
- (f) Payment of tuition and fees and reimbursement for authorized items will not be authorized during periods of leave of absence for reasons specified in *e* above or for courses repeated because of academic failure.
- (g) When a participant is authorized leave of absence for reasons other than academic failure, the commanding officer, Student Detachment, will notify The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP, of effective date of absence and expected date of return of the individual.
- (h) Contractual procedure.
 1. Contracts for payment of tuition and other fees to the university will be made by the Department of the Army in accordance with Section IV, AR 350-200.
 2. Reimbursement for incidental expenses will be made in accordance with Section V, AR 350-200. Reimbursement cannot be authorized until the contract for participation in the program has been negotiated and is in effect.

11. Application for appointment as a Commissioned Officer. *a. Participants enrolled in hospital schools of nursing, programs of home economics, and curricula of occupational therapy.*

- (1) The Army commander in whose area the enlistee is assigned will be responsible for the processing of the completed application for appointment in the Army Nurse Corps or Army Medical Specialist Corps, U.S. Army Reserve. See AR 601-139.
- (2) *Enlistee will complete the application for appointment with concurrent active duty, under the provisions of AR 601-139, not less than 6 months prior to graduation. Student nurse participants will comply with the provisions of paragraph 12a(3), AR 601-139. In addition, candidates for appointment in the Army Medical Specialist Corps will submit the following:*
 - (a) *Student Dietitian.* Application for the Army Dietetic Internship under the provisions of AR 601-136, except that paragraph 5 of that regulation will not apply.
 - (b) *Student Occupational Therapists.* Application for the Army Occupational Therapy Clinical Affiliation under the provisions of AR 601-136, except that paragraph 5 of that regulation will not apply, or under the provisions of AR 601-139, if participating under Plan II or Plan III (para. 4f(3)).
- (3) Not less than 4 months prior to graduation, the Army commander will forward the completed application with evidence of a favorably completed National Agency Check, with exception of final transcript of grades and the verification of nurse licensure (as pertains to nurses) to The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP. Final transcript and verification of nurse licensure will be forwarded directly to The Surgeon General as soon as they become available. Upon determination that the enlistee meets the qualifications for appointment, The Surgeon General will request that the Army commander be furnished the authority for separation of the enlistee, appointment in the grade of second lieutenant, and assignment instructions, which will

provide for approximately 6 weeks TDY to the Student Detachment, Medical Field Service School, Brooke Army Medical Center, Fort Sam Houston, Tex., while en route to new duty station, for the purpose of attending the ANC-AMSC Officer Basic Course.

- (4) Upon graduation, the participant will arrange to have forwarded to the commanding officer, Student Detachment of the respective Army area by the most expeditious means—
 - (a) An official transcript of grades.
 - (b) Report of official notification of the results of nurse licensure examination, if applicable.
- (5) Upon graduation, participant will forward to The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP, a statement containing three preferences of assignment (hospital or geographical location in the United States), clinical interest and other pertinent information for assignment purposes.

b. Participants enrolled in collegiate schools of nursing.

- (1) The Army commander in whose area the enlistee is assigned will be responsible for completion of the documents for application for appointment in the Army Nurse Corps, Army Reserve (AR 601-139).
- (2) Participant will submit documents for application for appointment with concurrent active duty under the provisions of AR 601-139 normally not less than 9 months prior to graduation. Those individuals who have elected to enter the program for the last 6 months prior to completion of the required curriculum in school will submit the application for appointment at the time of submission of the application for entry into the program.
- (3) Applications for appointment will be forwarded directly to The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP, for determination of professional and medical qualifications for selection. Letter of transmittal will include day, month, and year of graduation. The Surgeon General will forward

the applications with allied papers to the appropriate Department of the Army Staff agency for action. Appointment will be tendered in the grade of second lieutenant for assignment to the Army Nurse Corps branch approximately 6 months prior to graduation. Participants appointed as officers under this program will be ordered to active duty with station at their respective schools to complete their required curriculum. They will receive full pay and allowances for officers of their grade and years of service for pay purposes. Student enlistees determined to be qualified for appointment as commissioned officers will be separated from enlisted status by the appropriate Army commander approximately 1 day preceding the effective date of appointment as an officer. The commanding officer of the Student Detachment of the Army headquarters in whose area the school is located will be responsible for the necessary processing and orientation including preparation of required records incident thereto while on a student status. Each student officer will submit to The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDPT-MP, at the earliest date, the following information:

- (a) Photostat of official notification of the results of State licensure examinations.
- (b) Three preferences of assignment (hospital or geographical location in the United States), clinical interests and other pertinent information for assignment purposes.
- (4) ~~Following completion of graduation and nurse licensure, The Adjutant General will issue assignment instructions which provide for approximately 6 weeks' TDY to the Student Detachment, Medical Field Service School, Brooke Army Medical Center, Fort Sam Houston, Tex., while en route to new duty station, for the purpose of attending the ANC-AMSC Officer Basic Course.~~

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12. Medical and administrative requirements.

a. A student participant who received a waiver for medical or physical defects to enlist will be ap-

pointed on the basis of the prior waiver at the time participant becomes eligible, provided there has been no change in the condition for which waiver was granted. This information will be indicated on DA Form 61, Standard Form 88, and initial orders for appointment and call to active duty, as follows:

b. All records of an enlistee who develops a medical condition or physical defect which precludes the individual's appointment in the Army Nurse Corps or Army Medical Specialist Corps will be forwarded by airmail to U.S. Army Reserve Com-

ponents Personnel Center, ATTN: RCPA-A, Ft. Benjamin Harrison, Ind., 46249, for review and disposition instructions. In such instances, copies of the enlistment medical examination (Standard Forms 88 and 89) will be forwarded with the transmittal correspondence. DA Form 61, Standard Form 88, and active duty orders of individuals granted waived by Headquarters, Department of the Army, will be marked: "Paragraph 12b, AR 601-19, applies. Waiver of (identify physical defect) granted on (date) by Headquarters, Department of the Army (DA file reference number)."

c. Medical examinations accomplished for the purpose of appointment as a commissioned officer under provisions AR 601-139 are valid for the purpose of separation from enlisted status necessary to effect such appointment.
