SUMMARY OF REGISTRANT EXAMINATIONS FOR INDUCTION

Reports Control Symbol MED-66(R4)

Effective 15 July 1969

This revision contains minor editorial changes. Local limited supplementation of this regulation is permitted but is not required. If supplements are issued, Army staff agencies and major Army commands will furnish one copy of each to The Surgeon General, ATTN: MEDAS; other commands will furnish one copy of each to the next higher headquarters.

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Section I. GENERAL

1. Purpose. This regulation provides instructions for the preparation of a monthly report on Selective Service registrants processed for military service under the existing Military Selective Service Act of 1967. The report is designed to provide current information on the overall examination results; the specific causes for disqualification; and the general physical and mental characteristics of examinees found acceptable. These data are necessary for a general appraisal of the availability of manpower and an evaluation of policies and standards with respect to the selection of men for military service.

2. Preparing agencies. The report will be prepared by each Armed Forces examining and entrance station (AFEES).

3. Form identification. The report will be submitted on DA Form 316 (Summary of Registrant Examinations for Induction) (Reports Control Symbol MED-66(R4)).

4. Frequency and routing. a. Frequency. The report will be prepared for each calendar month.

b. Routing.

(1) *Originals.* Each AFEES will submit the original of each prepared report to The Surgeon

General, ATTN: MEDAS-SA, Department of the Army, Washington, DC 20315.

(2) *Additional copies.* Additional copies of the reports will be submitted as follows: One copy to Commanding General, United States Army Recruiting Command, ATTN: USARCCM-S, Hampton, VA 23369, and one copy to the Commanding Officer of the appropriate United States Army Recruiting District.

5. Due date. The reports will be dispatched not later than 5 workdays after the close of the report month.

6. Method of transmission. All reports will be submitted by airmail or by equally expeditious means.

7. Sources of information. Information required for this report will be obtained from DD Form 47 (Record of Induction) and Standard Form 88 (Report of Medical Examination) prepared for each processed registrant.

8. Signature. The report will be signed by the commanding officer of the AFEES submitting the report or by his designated representative. The name and title of the person signing the report will be typed in the space provided on the form.

Section II. GENERAL REPORTING INSTRUCTIONS

9. Separate reports. a. United States. AFEES routinely processing registrants from local boards in more than one State will prepare a separate report for each State. The name of the State will be entered in the space provided for this purpose in the upper right corner of the report form.

b. Puerto Rico. The AFEES in Puerto Rico will submit two separate reports: one for examinees tested with the current Armed Forces Qualification Test (AFQT); the other for examinees tested with the Spanish Test "Examen calificacion de fuerzas armadas" (ECFA). For the purpose of identification the latter report will be labeled "Tested with ECFA," under the heading "Summary of Registrant Examinations for Induction."

10. Corrected individual reports. Whenever errors are discovered in the reports after they have been forwarded, corrected DA Form 316 will be submitted to the appropriate agencies in accordance with paragraph 4. These reports will be marked "CORRECTED" in the upper right corner margin of the form.

11. Composition of report. The report is divided into three parts. Part I deals with the preinduction examination results of Selective Service registrants forwarded by the local boards to the AFEES for determining their acceptability for military service in the Armed Forces. Part II deals with the induction examination results. Part III is reserved for miscellaneous information.

Section III. PREINDUCTION EXAMINATION (PART I)

12. General. a. Registrants to be reported. Only registrants whose status with respect to their qualification for military service was definitely determined and for whom a DD Form 62 (Statement of Acceptability) was prepared will be reported. Holdovers at the end of the report month because the processing was not completed, and registrants who were returned to the local boards for administrative reasons before their acceptability had been definitely established, will not be included.

b. Registrants not previously examined and registrants previously examined. The required data will be reported separately for registrants "not previously examined" and "previously examined." The following registrants will be considered "previously examined":

(1) Registrants who were previously examined at an AFEES for military service and were disqualified. These will include examinees marked "Yes" under item 15, DD Form 47.

(2) Registrants who have served with any of the Armed Forces and were separated from the service, but are being reexamined under existing directives. These will include examinees marked "Yes" under item 8a, DD Form 47.

c. Classification by race. The entries on the report will be made separately by race (from item 8, SF 88), as indicated on the form. The term "Total" will include all races; the term "Other" will include all races, except Negroid.

13. General results (sec. A). In addition to the distribution by type and race (para 12*b* and *c*), the examinees will be distributed as follows by results of examination:

a. Acceptable (line 1). This will include all examinees so classified under item 22a, DD Form 47;

b. Not acceptable (line 2). This will include all examinees so classified under item 22b, DD Form 47.

14. Distribution of nonacceptable registrants by disqualifying cause (sec. B). The distribution of the nonacceptable registrants (sec. A, line 2) will be made on the basis of the boxes checked under item 22b, DD Form 47, and reported on lines 4 through 9. Registrants who were classified

on the basis of the AFQT in mental group IV, but who were tested and failed the AQB will be reported as "Trainability Limited" (line 5). This line (line 5) will be also used for registrants in Puerto Rico who met the minimum ECFA requirements but failed the EFB (English Fluency Battery) and the AQB requirements. Medically qualified registrants who failed the minimum AFQT or ECFA requirements will be reported on line 6. Registrants who failed the AFQT, or ECFA, and were simultaneously medically disqualified will be reported on line 7. Registrants who qualified on the mental tests but were disqualified for psychiatric reasons will be reported on line 8. Registrants for whom both boxes "psychiatric" and "other medical" have been checked on DD Form 47 will be recorded as psychiatric disqualification only (line 8). Disqualification for other medical reasons (excluding psychiatric) will be reported on line 9. Total of each column (line 10) should equal the corresponding number of not acceptable as reported on line 2.

15. Distribution of registrants found acceptable by physical category and mental group (sec. C). *a. General.* Registrants, both not previously and previously examined, who were found acceptable on preinduction examination, as shown on line 1, will be cross-distributed by physical category and mental group, except those in Puerto Rico tested with ECFA (see *b* below). The distribution will be made on the basis of items 18 and 20a, DD Form 47. Medically qualified registrants who failed the mental test(s), but who were administratively declared acceptable, will be recorded on line 15. The column "All" presents a summation of physical categories A, B, and C of the related mental groups. (Ordinarily, there should be no entries under physical category C.) The totals of the columns "All" on line 16 should equal the corresponding sum of the not previously and previously examined acceptable registrants as reported on line 1.

b. Puerto Rico. For registrants tested with ECFA, no distribution by mental group is required. Proper entries will be made only on lines 15 and 16.

Section IV. INDUCTION EXAMINATION (PART II)

16. General. *a. Registrants to be reported.* Only registrants whose induction processing has been completed during the report period will be reported.

b. Classification by type of examination. The examinees will be classified by type of examination under sections D and E of the report. The classification will reflect the type of induction examination indicated under item 23, DD Form 47: Physical Inspection; Complete Medical Examination (Lapse of Time), or Complete Medical and Mental Examination.

c. Classification by race. The classification by race under sections D and E will be made as provided in paragraph 12c.

17. General results (sec. D). The examinees for induction will be distributed by result of examination on the basis of items 23a and 23b, DD Form 47.

a. Inducted (line 17). This will include all those who were inducted (excluding those found acceptable but not inducted).

b. Disqualified (line 18). This will include all those for whom item 23b ("Found Not Acceptable for Induction into the Armed Forces"), DD Form 47, is checked.

c. Total examined (line 19). The total examined should include the inducted (line 17), the disqualified (line 18), and those who were found acceptable but not inducted. (The last number should be

specified under "Remarks:" Found Acceptable—Not Inducted: Total ———; Negroid ———, and Other ———.)

c. Number of Inductees Assigned (line 20). The distribution of inductees by service assigned will be made on basis of item 24, DD Form 47.

18. Distribution of disqualified registrants by disqualifying cause (sec. E). *a. General.* The distribution of the disqualified registrants at the time of induction by disqualifying cause (lines 21 through 26) will be accomplished on the basis of the boxes checked under item 23b, DD Form 47, in the same manner as stated in paragraph 14, for the distribution of registrants not acceptable on pre-induction examination. The total disqualified of each column on line 27 should equal the corresponding number reported on line 18.

b. Qualified insular Puerto Ricans and Spanish-speaking Virgin Island personnel examined for induction in CONUS. As provided by AR 601-270, Spanish-speaking personnel from Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, who qualified mentally at the time of their preinduction examination on the basis of the "Examen calificacion de fuerzas" (ECFA), appear for induction at an AFEEs within CONUS, may require retesting at the time of induction (app R, AR 601-270). The number of these examinees, classified as a result of these tests as "Trainability Limited (V-O)" or as AFQT failures, will be reported on lines 22 and 23, respectively.

Section V. MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION (PART III)

19. Information required by special directives. In addition to the specific items 28 through 33, such information as may be required from time to time by special directives will be reported in the part of the report under "Remarks." The data reported under part III will not be included in parts I or II.

20. Physicians, dentists, and allied specialists (items 28-29). These registrants, so identified by the Selective Service Local Boards, will be reported by utilizing the spaces of items 28 and 29. The data recorded under these items will be limited

to specifying the number of such registrants examined and the number acceptable.

21. Conscientious objectors (I-O) (items 30-31). The results of the examinations of conscientious objectors, classified as I-O by the Selective Service local boards, will be reported as specified under these items.

22. Acceptability undetermined (items 32-33). The number of registrants whose acceptability at preinduction or induction has not been definitely determined at the close of the report period will be specified under these items.
