## PROCUREMENT OF DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY AMMUNITION INSPECTORS (SURVEILLANCE) AND SAFETY OFFICERS (EXPLOSIVES) FOR AIR FORCE POSITIONS

*This regulation outlines the agreement between the Departments of the Army and Air Force for Procuring Department of the Army Ammunition Inspectors (Surveillance) and Safety Officers (Explosives) to fill Air Force positions, and for retaining them as employees of the Departments. It applies to civilian employees in both the competitive and excepted service. AFR 40-928 contains the Air Force procedure for hiring Ammunition Inspectors (Surveillance) and Safety Officers (Explosives).*

**1. Policy.** The Departments of Army and Air Force will take reciprocal measures to:

a. Retain qualified Ammunition Inspectors (Surveillance) and Safety Officers (Explosives) in positions that will permit maximum use of their skills.

b. Provide continuity of service and maximum tenure. This policy is based on the scarcity of qualified Ammunition Inspectors (Surveillance) and Safety Officers (Explosives) and the technical knowledge and specialized training required for their work.

**2. Air Force Procurement.** When Ammunition Inspector (Surveillance) or Safety Officer (Explosives) positions in the Air Force cannot be filled through Air Force recruitment or in-service placement, Ammunition Inspectors (Surveillance) and Safety Officers (Explosives) of the Department of the Army will be procured. Requests for referral of recommended candidates will be sent to the Commanding Officer, Savanna Army Depot, Savanna, Illinois, ATTN: Ammunition Civilian Career Office. Positions for which referrals have been requested will be filled from other sources only if:

a. Candidates referred by the Department of the Army are not acceptable, or

b. The Department of the Army does not have candidates available for referral.

**3. Tours of Duty.** An Ammunition Inspector (Surveillance) or Safety Officer (Explosives) assigned to an Air Force position outside the adjacent 48 States and the District of Columbia will be required to sign a transportation agreement specifying an agreed period of service as specified in chapter 0.1, AFM 40-1.

**4. Availability for Return to Department of the Army.** When the Air Force no longer requires the services of an Ammunition Inspector (Surveillance) or a Safety Officer (Explosives) who has previously served in that capacity with the Department of the Army, the employing command will notify the Director of Aerospace Safety (AFIAS-G), Norton AFB, California 92409, who in turn will notify the Ammunition Civilian Career Office. The notification will be made regardless of the reason for terminating the employee's services with the Air Force (e.g., completion of agreed period of service, resignation, reduction-in-force, or removal). A statement will be included in the notification indicating the reason(s) for terminating the employee's services.

This regulation supersedes AFR 40-10/AR 601-336, 16 May 1955, as amended.
