## INTRODUCING THE FELLOWSHIP

The John S. McCain Strategic Defense Fellowship Program is a highly selective, 12-month immersive appointment designed to develop the next generation of civilian leaders in national security. Implemented by the John S. McCain National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2019, the program provides recent advanced-degree graduates with the opportunity to work alongside senior defense officials, contribute to high-impact policy initiatives, and help drive innovation across the Department.

Fellows are placed across a wide range of DoD Components and mission areas – including policy, intelligence, acquisitions, research, and more – with all opportunities located in the National Capital Region. Through real-world assignments and targeted professional development, Fellows build the leadership skills and strategic perspective essential to advancing U.S. national security.

As a McCain Fellow, you will help drive the mission forward – where strategy, service, and innovation meet.

The McCain Fellowship is built on a dual promise: to develop the leader you are today, and to launch the leader you'll become tomorrow.

As a training ground, the program places fellows in immersive roles at the center of the Department of Defense. #### SENIOR MENTORSHIP

As a key pillar of the fellowship program, Fellows build a meaningful relationship with a senior leader within the Department of Defense. This mentorship offers Fellows with access to important knowledge, career development support, and strategic advice that expands the fellow's understanding of the Department's mission while fellows navigate complex challenges in their field.



#### **NETWORKING**

Fellows engage in a dynamic networking experience, connecting with peers, program alumni, employees and senior leaders across the Department. Through program events, handson collaboration, and meaningful engagements, they gain access to valuable insights and build connections that enhance their personal and professional growth. These connections continue to support and empower them well beyond the fellowship year.



#### TRAINING & DEVELOPMENT

Fellows work through an Individual Development plan that outlines personalized training and development goals, with the support of a training stipend to pursue relevant courses, trainings, and certification programs. These opportunities are designed to strengthen their skills, advance their professional development, and support their growth as future leaders.
